What is a mobile farmers market?

A farmers market that comes to you! The REC purchases fruits and vegetables from local farms and drives it to central locations for your shopping convenience.

What is the Healthy Incentives Program (HIP)?

HIP helps you buy more fruits and vegetables for your household. When you use your SNAP to buy fruits and vegetables from the Mobile Market, you receive the amount of your purchase added instantly back to your card with a monthly limit of between \$40 and \$80, depending on household size.

For payment options, we accept:

Accepted payment methods include cash, SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program), MasterCard, VISA, DISCOVER NETWORK, MASS DTA (Commonwealth of Massachusetts), and the Healthy Incentives Program.
